Hello everyone

As a new parish we have, for the first time, entered into a time of preparation for the holiest of weeks in our Christian faith. Lent holds great significance for Christians around the world and can be a challenging time; a time of questioning; a time of reflection. But, above all things, Lent is a time to appreciate the selflessness of Jesus as He approached Jerusalem to face His harshest critics, the religious establishment.

The Gospels tell us that Jesus, knowing the path that awaited Him in Jerusalem, willingly set His face towards the city. This decision was not merely a physical journey but an overwhelmingly spiritual and sacrificial commitment. His purpose was clear — to confront the religious authorities and ultimately fulfil the divine plan of redemption.

As Christians, the observance of Lent allows us to follow Jesus' journey in a symbolic way. Through personal challenges, like fasting, prayer, and acts of self-denial, we are invited to reflect on our own lives, acknowledge our shortcomings, and seek a deeper connection with God. While we are now part-way through the 40-days of Lent, which symbolises the period Jesus spent in the wilderness, facing trials and temptations before beginning His public ministry, we are still able to focus our own lives on Him, as best we can.

Within our new parish, we have each had to face some form of challenge and change. However, Jesus' confrontation with religious leaders in Jerusalem highlights the importance of standing up for one's convictions and facing these challenges with faith and courage. Lent encourages us to examine our faith and what it really means to us. It also gives us the space to confront our own spiritual battles and, in the strength of God's Holy Spirit, emerge stronger in our commitment to following the teachings of Christ.

The ultimate destination of Lent, of course, is Easter; a celebration of the resurrection and triumph over sin and death. These days of challenge prepare us to fully embrace the joy of Easter and the promise of new life in Christ.

Through Lent, and especially through Holy Week, we are given new opportunities to draw closer to God, examine our hearts, and align our lives, once again, with the transformative message of the Gospel.

Our parish life has changed, our spiritual experiences may be changing, but we are still all called by the same Lord. I hope that we can follow Him together into the future.

May you be filled with Hope in the One true God.
